West Central Conservancy District has become one of the largest Conservancy Districts in Indiana. It has prospered by using resources responsibly rather than by taxing freeholders for services.

Recently the District has been working to supply sewers to subdivisions served by failing septic systems. These neighborhoods include Jeto Lake, Indian Head Lake, Price Heights, Liberty Meadows, Woodcreek, Sheffield, Avondale, Avon Heights, Andrews Subdivision, and Jessup Meadows. The District has made substantial infrastructure investments to assist with a new school and the industrial buildings along 100S. A new interceptor to accommodate future residential expansion in the northwest section of the District, new sewer extension for the Easton Gray Development, and extensive plant capacity upgrades.

The District's current and future projects include re-routing the force main and rebuilding the Morris Street lift station and providing service to Jessup Meadows. The District is in preliminary discussions for an interlocal agreement with the Town of Danville and Hendricks County to begin a new sewer line on the southwest corner of the District to accommodate the county's new maintenance facility on 300E. This project will benefit new developments at the southwest corner of the District.

The District is proud of not increasing sewer rates in 23 years, while continuing to maintain financial stability without compromising the financial security of the District and its freeholders.
